GENERAL TRACK RULES

- Race Receivers Are Mandatory In All Divisions
- Transponders Are Mandatory for all divisions, anyone found not using the device as required will NOT BE SCORED for that race. Transponders are available for rent at the speedway pit shack.
- All Cars Competing Must Furnish Stateline Motorsports Park With a W-9 FORM and a DRIVER REGISTRATION FORM Prior to any Car Competing. Both Forms are available on newstatelinespeedway.com or at the track in the Pit Shack.
 Free Registration is offered prior to April 15th. After April 15th, there will be a \$50.00 registration fee.
- All Cars Must Have Numbers that are CLEARLY VISIBLE on the roof and both sides of the car, we will no longer allow duct tape numbers or spray can numbers, as many times they cannot be clearly seen from the tower. Any car deemed unreadable from the tower will not be scored.
- **Duplicate car numbers will not be permitted** within the same class. If there are cars that carry duplicate numbers, these cars will be asked to add a letter to the beginning or end of their number. Added numbers or letters must be legible. If there are duplicate car numbers within the same class, the car with the most races in the previous season will have priority at the time of registration. The track retains the right to change car numbers as needed, to assure accurate scoring.
- Advertising that is deemed unsuitable or offensive will not be allowed.
- All drivers are responsible for registering their car each night, PILL DRAW CUT OFF IS **6:30**. The Car must be in the pits to draw. Anyone not checked in at least 30 minutes before race time will push the field. However, if there is a circumstance beyond your control, we are allowing you to call someone at the track to draw a position in your absence. This is limited to 2 times per season. If you have someone draw a number for you and you don't make it to the track, this is still considered one of your allotted byes.

SAFETY RULES

An Approved Fire Suppression System is Mandatory for the Super Late Models. The system must be securely mounted & accessible from both Inside and Outside of Car. Stateline Speedway recommends the use of an Approved Fire Suppression System for all cars competing. It is also suggested to have a fire extinguisher in the hauler.

- ASA or SNELL HELMETS MANDATORY, Not Older Than 5 Years from Date of Manufacture.
- FIRE SUIT MANDATORY-Fireproof clothing must not be torn
- All driver SEAT BELT systems shall not be in excess of 3 years of age past the date of manufacture.
- HEAD and NECK RESTRAINTS Mandatory for SUPER LATE, CRATE LATE, UMP & ANYONE 16 & UNDER. Stateline Speedway HIGHLY recommends the use of a head and neck restraints for all drivers.
- A Padded Neck Brace IS MANDATORY minimum protection for all divisions.
- Any Extra Weight Must Have 2-1/2" GRADE 5 or Better Bolts Holding Weight on NO EXCEPTIONS!
- NO WEIGHT Can Be Mounted or Bolted to Any Suspension Parts If Weights are found Mounted that way, they will be removed before the Car goes onto the track.
- All Weights MUST be Painted White with Driver Number on them, NO EXCEPTIONS!
- You MUST have a TOW HOOK or Chain on the Front and Rear of car.
- ATV's may not be used to push start any racecar.

PIT ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- Anyone entering the pits is responsible for reading and understanding the "Release and Waiver of Liability and Indemnity Agreement" The pit area is not to be entered at any time unless officials are on the premises.
- Anyone caught in the pit area without a wrist-band will be immediately suspended along with all members of the team they are associated with, this includes the car and driver. No Refunds!

PIT ENTRY REQUIREMENTS FOR MINORS

- Prior to entering the pit area, ALL children, under the age of 18, must have a MINOR RELEASE form signed by their parents. The MINOR RELEASE form can be found on newstatelinespeedway.com under Rules/Forms. This form must be filled out and presented prior to a minor's entry into the pit area. The Release Form will be kept on file and referred to as needed.
- Every Minor entering the pit area MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY A Responsible Adult!
- Stateline Speedway reserves the right to implement penalties for unsupervised children at their discretion. 1st Offense = 1-month Suspension; 2nd Offense = Expulsion.

<u>PIT ACCESSORY VEHICLES (ATV's, UTV's, Mini bikes)</u>

MUST have Insurance and be registered at the track!

- To register you must provide a copy of Current Insurance Card, Make, Model and Color
- Registration cost is \$50 per year. Individuals with a handicap card in their name, will not be charged.
- Vehicle must be registered before operating at the track.
 - Penalties for operating wheeler prior to registration will be...
 - **1st offense**: Parked for the Night
 - 2nd Offense: PARKED REST OF THE YEAR
- Anyone operating a motorized vehicle must have a valid Driver's License.
- A seat must be utilized for all riders, with a maximum of 2 people. No riding on front or rear carriers.
- Race cars have the right of way! All accessory vehicles MUST yield to race cars! Failure to do so will result in being parked.
- Vehicles MUST be parked, or in trailer as soon as races are over.
- You will be issued a sticker that permits use of that vehicle in the pit area at the track it must be displayed on the vehicle.
- Stateline Speedway reserves the right to revoke operation at their discretion.

RESERVED PIT SPACES

- Race teams may reserve pit parking for the season. Prior Year Occupation has priority in reserving the same spot. A PARKING sticker will be provided once your spot is reserved.
- Only Stateline Speedway can assign pit spots.
- The track is not responsible for ANY vehicles left at the track, whether in the pits or parking lot

FINES AND/OR SUSPENSIONS WILL BE IMPOSED FOR THE FOLLOWING

Drivers are responsible for the actions of their crew members

- Drivers doing spinouts or speeding in the pits
- Crew members entering the track during race conditions including cautions.
- Driving on the racetrack or in the pit area during off hours. If you need access during off hours you may call ahead and make arrangements.
- Driving a car without registering both car and driver
- Leaving ANY racecar on the track
- If anyone associated with your team goes to another car or pit without an official
- Any abusive physical or verbal altercations with officials or employees
- Taking a car back onto the racetrack after the races are over
- Entering the track during green flag conditions
- Not making requested changes to car by the specified time
- Failing to leave the track when ordered to do so
- Going to the flag stand to confront an official.
- Leaving tires at the track will forfeit their money won for that night.
- Using Alcohol or Drugs: Any driver with a noticeable amount of alcohol or drugs present will not be allowed on the track.

Any of the preceding rules may be subject to revision if it is felt that the change would be in the best interest of safety. Track Officials have the right to make decisions and to rule accordingly, in the interest of safety, without recourse from drivers and/or owners. Track Officials will decide anything not covered in the preceding rules and regulations if and when it becomes necessary.
